Co-prime Labelings of Graphs

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Let G = (V, E) be a graph of order n: An injection $f : V \to \mathbb{N}$, where \mathbb{N} is the set of natural numbers, is called a co-prime labeling of G if for any two distinct vertices $u, v \in V, uv \in E$ if and only if f(u) and f(v) are co-prime. A prime number p is said to be used in the co-prime labeling f if p divides f(v) for some $v \in V$: We prove that every graph admits a co- prime labeling. Let $\mu(G, f)$ be the number of primes used in the co-prime labeling f and let $\mu(G) = \min_f \{\mu(G, f) : f \text{ is a co-prime labeling of } G\}$. We obtain upper and lower bounds for $\mu(G)$. Further we determine the value of $\mu(G)$ for several classes of graphs.

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
